Thanksgiving Time! – Christmas isn’t the only time when we are “*making a list and checking it twice.*” Many of you have probably started your “*lists*” for the Thanksgiving feasts you’ll share with family and friends. There are lots of SCRIP rebates to be had as you shop for your party supplies. When you shop our most popular SCRIP merchants - *Meijer, Wal-Mart/Sam’s Club, GFS, Target, Jamison’s, Feder’s, or New Haven’s Custom Quality Meats*, each purchase means cash back for the parish and for you. If you shop *Costco*, consider purchasing a *VISA* card for your purchases. Pick up a current order form to see if gift cards are available for the places you will be shopping.

Veterans Day – This weekend our nation will honor our military veterans. SCRIP would like to honor our “SCRIP” veterans as well. You know who you are and we appreciate your loyalty. So, each “SCRIP vet” who places an order of \$100 or more, November 9 – 12, will be entered into a drawing for a “*Veteran’s Giveaway.*”

“ New Comer” November – If you have never tried SCRIP, this is a great time to do so. The concept can be somewhat perplexing and often keeps some people from giving it a try. So, during November, we will keep track of all our new customers and each time our new customers place an order they will be entered into a drawing. 5 prizes will be awarded as our way of thanking our new customers. We welcomed 1 new customer last weekend, so their chances of winning are looking pretty good. Don’t miss out on this great opportunity to try SCRIP.

Fun SCRIP Facts & Figures – If a family spends \$100/week on groceries x 52 weeks, they spend \$5,200/year. If they use SCRIP gift cards with a 4% rebate to pay for those groceries, the rebate earned in a year is \$208 - \$104 in parish profit and \$104 in personal profit. Now imagine if 1,000 parish families use SCRIP to pay for their groceries each week for a year – that would mean \$104,000 profit for the parish as well as \$104 for each of those 1,000 families. Everyone buys groceries; are you using SCRIP gift cards when you grocery shop?

Parents can put money into the student's account through your MealpayPlus online account at www.mealpayplus.com or by calling 866-662-3382 for a small fee. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$13.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the general account as well.
