A Few Housekeeping Items:

- 1. Use of 11 (including driver) to 15 passenger vans to transport children on field trips is prohibited.** (policy below)
"Removal of seats from a vehicle designed to transport 11 (including driver) to 15 passenger vans to make the vehicle a 10 or less passenger vehicle is not allowed. Mini-vans may be used to transport children/adults. A mini-van is defined as a passenger vehicle designed to transport no more than 8 total occupants. A parent with an 11-15 passenger van is welcome to drive his/her own child in that vehicle on a field trip, just not able to transport other children."
- 2. Please write your child's name on his/her lunchbox in Sharpie in a few spots.** The lost shall be found and returned!
- 3. I will be addressing LGBTQ issues in relation to school in coming weeks - Church teaching, student protections, etc.** Our goal is to provide a safe environment in which students can grow in mind, body, and soul through our Catholic faith.

SCRIP NEWS

Back-to-School Night – We enjoyed seeing lots of our school families on Monday night, especially the families that were inquiring about SCRIP for the first time. For those of you who picked up one of the *SPECIAL* order forms: Orders using the special form must be turned in no later than Monday, August 26 in order to qualify for the "Back-to-School" giveaway. 200 forms were printed but only about 100 families stopped to pick up the form, so be sure to turn it in. You have a great chance of winning!

Schedule Note – Remember when there is no school on Friday, SCRIP sales take place on *Thursday* instead of *Friday*. This schedule change will take place for the next two weeks. Next week sales will take place on *Thursday, August 29* and there will be *NO Sales on Friday, August 30*. The following week there is *NO school again on Friday, September 6*, so SCRIP sales will take place on *Thursday, September 5*. There are also *NO SCRIP sales over Labor Day weekend, August 31 & September 1* and the SCRIP office will be closed on Monday, September 2. SCRIP orders will be filled on Tuesday, September 3.

SCRIP 101 – We want to remind you of a few basic details when filling out the SCRIP order form.

- *Name* – is your name, not your student's
- *Number* – is the same as your contribution envelope number-*if you don't know it, leave it blank*
- *Student's name & Room #* - are very important so that we can send it back to the correct room
- *Line Items* – fill in the number of cards you want in the first boxes, fill in the total dollar amount in the
 - extended box – *i.e. Meijer – under \$25 mark 2, under \$100 mark 1, extended box mark \$150*
- *Totaling* – putting the totals on the front & back of the page helps to verify that your order was filled correctly

Help us fill your orders accurately by taking time to follow these steps. When in doubt, feel free to ask us; we are here to help.

Volunteers needed – It's not too late to sign up to be a SCRIP volunteer. There are many different jobs with different levels of commitment. Volunteering to help with sales on a Friday, Saturday or Sunday is a great way to see how other parishioners use SCRIP and can give you some great ideas on how to get the most out of the program for yourself. Saturday sales take place after the 5pm Mass and are about a 30 minute commitment; Friday sales are about a 75 minute commitment from approximately 7:45 – 9 am; and Sundays are also about a 75 minute commitment from approximately 9:45 – 11 am. We like to have about 6 – 8 teams so that you only have to work every 6 – 8 weeks. Many hands make light work!

INFORMATION ON INDIANA'S ILEARN ASSESSMENT

ILEARN is Indiana's new online computer-adaptive assessment designed to measure your child's proficiency based on the Indiana Academic Standards. Overall student results in ILEARN are reported as four-digit scale scores. The overall scale scores for Indiana students align with the four proficiency levels (Below Proficiency, Approaching Proficiency, At Proficiency, and Above Proficiency). The report provides your family with useful information, including the following: how your child scored on the assessment, whether the scores meet state proficiency standards, and how your child's scores compare with students in his/her school, corporation, and state.

Based on your child's ILEARN scale score, he/she is placed into one of the four proficiency levels: Below Proficiency, Approaching Proficiency, At Proficiency, or Above Proficiency. Students performing At or Above Proficiency are on track for college and career readiness.

Your child's test score can vary if the test is taken several times. His/her knowledge and skills likely fall within a score range and not just at a precise number. Scores are an estimation of your child's ability.

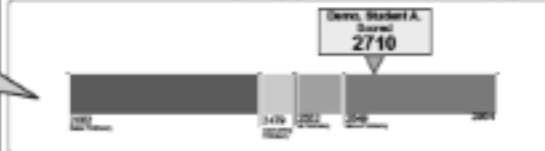
The comparison scores table shows how your child's scale score compares with peers at the school, corporation, and state levels.

Bar charts indicate how your child performed. The black bar shows your child's performance. The white bar shows the expectation by domain. The green band shows the range of performance expected over time typically associated with the assessment's small measurement error.

English/Language Arts reports include descriptions of your child's performance on the Performance Task (i.e., writing portion). If a condition code appears, your child's response could not be scored. Unscorable responses include responses that are blank, insufficient, written in a non-scorable language, off-topic, off-purpose, or illegible.
