NEWS NOTES From Your SCHOOL NURSE

Are you chronically late turning in health requirements for school?

Dear Parents: Kindly, make appointments today while you are thinking of it. While we are all excited for the break—time does slip away pretty fast in summer. Please, do not put off getting due vaccinations until the last minute. All pre-K, Kindergarteners, and 5th graders in all of Fort Wayne are due to receive their vaccinations and/or physicals. Appointments fill up quickly everywhere. **Indiana state law requires these to be completed prior to the first day of school.** No excuses-- unless birthday is after the end of July. The state grants only 2 week grace period, in that matter. Let's all be compliant and on time.

Physicals and immunizations are given at your provider's office. However, you may need to visit CVS minute clinics, Super Shots, Redimed, and other clinics if your provider is out of the needed vaccines or appointments.

Kindergarten free vision screenings (form located in the kindergarten packet) must be **scheduled by July 1st!** Kindergarten students are not included in our annual health screenings until first grade. Make sure to call an eye doctor listed on that form, now, for this important free vision screening.

It is soon time to let the children "run, jump, and play!" Enjoy summer and send them back to us healthy and strong for another great year. -Mrs. C. Thrower, RN.
